## Training: the Key to Success

How do you touch as many people as possible with the love of Christ? By training leaders who will then train others to follow in their footsteps. That is the essence of discipleship. It is also the method the Assemblies of God of Madagascar is using to reach this island. We have a residential Bible School that is presently training 150 future Pastors. It combines strong Biblical teaching with practical ministry to prepare them for effective ministry.

In addition, this year we started an extension center for those who cannot attend the Bible School full-time, but want to train for ministry. Our extension center already has 55 students in it. Plans are being made to start other extension centers throughout the island in the future. This year, I have had the opportunity to teach four classes, in both the residential Bible School and extension center. Investment in training all brings eternal rewards!

## Touching Lives: One Person at a Time

Many times we tell you about the ministry that we do that touches many lives, like crusades or seminars. But another aspect is the one-on-one ministry. In this area, God has used Carey in many ways. Through many avenues, God regularly brings women and young ladies into her life. Maybe it's a parent of a classmate of our children, or a friend of a friend, at a church meeting, or even one of our orphan girls. This has allowed Carey many opportunities to share Christ's

love to those who needed it. To challenge a Malagasy mother to grow spiritually through discipleship, or a young lady to continue to seek God's will for her life. Even now, she has been meeting two times a week with one of our orphan girls, Viviane, to help her learn English. Viviane has a desire to learn English and then maybe go on to Bible School or maybe be a teacher. Through Carey's influence in her life, she can help guide her in the direction God would have for her.
